Each classic will have a designated first-round class in which the last class of each division will be the designated class for the first round score of the classic. Exhibitors must enter the classic prior to the start of the first round class. Scratches are not permitted after the first round class has begun. Horses must have entered, shown, and completed the course in at least two of the respective hunter division classes over fences at this show. To be judged on performance and soundness, suitability and manners to count. To be scored under the open numerical judging system. To be shown over a course of approximately 10 jumps of height designated by qualifying division. The twelve horses with the highest scores from the first round will return to jump a second round over a different course. In the event of equality in the first round, all equal scored will return for the second round. Scores will be combined from the first round with the second round to determine overall winners. Trophy to first, ribbons through 12, and prize money divided as follows: 30%, 22%, 15%, 10%, 7%, 6%, 5%, 5%

Each class must have a minimum of two judges. All judges will sit together and provide one score. One judge must be an R judge, the other may be either an R or r judge. The judging panel will provide one score and the scores from each round will be either averaged or added as specified in the prize list to obtain the overall total for each horse. No judging panel may award the same base score to any two competitors in any one round. The first round shall be judged on performance, hunter pace, jumping style, quality and substance, and movement. After the judges base score is given, one point will be added for each high option fence jumped. The Option Bonus Score of one additional point must be awarded even if there is a refusal, rail down or loss of good jumping style at that higher height option fence, providing that the horse-and-rider combination does jump the higher height option fence. (Maximum of four points). The second round shall be judged on performance, hunter pace, jumping style, quality and substance, movement, handiness and brilliance of pace. Handiness is defined as ground

saving movement without adversely affecting performance or style. Brilliance of pace is defined as a faster pace than ordinary, without sacrificing performance or style. Handiness is taken into account in the judges' base score. After the judges' base score is given, one point will be added for each high option fence jumped. ## 601. CPHA STYLE OF RIDING NORTHERN CHAMPIONSHIP



Entry Fee: \$125

### SILICON VALLEY EQUESTRIAN FESTIVAL II ONLY

**Eligibility:** The CPHA Style of Riding Championship Class is open to all Jr/Am riders who are current members of the CPHA, and whose trainers are current members of the CPHA. The rider must have competed in at least one CPHA Style of Riding Class during the current show year in order to qualify for the Championships.

**Class Conditions:** This class is a jumper seat equitation class held in the jumper ring over a course of fences set at 1.00m- 1.05m in height with spreads to 1.15m. The course must contain a triple or two double combinations. No Liverpool. The course should be of the type used in a Children/Adult Jumper class. Time allowed will be calculated at 350 meters per minute. A jumper type horse and conventional jumper equipment will not be penalized and standing and running martingales are permitted. Draw reins and German martingales are not permitted. Any rider completing the first round without jumping and/or time faults and with a total score of 70 or better will also complete a jump off/work off round.

**Judging:** The class will be judged under a modified Table II, 2a format with jumping and time faults being deducted from the rider's equitation score (4 points deducted for each rail down and 1 point deducted for each time fault). At the completion of the first round all riders with clear rounds (no jumping or time faults) AND a total score of 70 or better will come back to complete the jump off/work off shortened course. The jump off/work off will be scored in the same manner as the first round, with an emphasis placed on an

efficient time saving pace and track. Time allowed will be based on a speed of 375m/m. The judges are asked to walk the course when possible and where there are striding options, the judges are asked not to penalize any option that might be used to achieve the best result appropriate to the track taken and the individual horse/rider combination. The judges will evaluate the rider's ability as a show jumping rider, and the manner in which the course was ridden regarding technical merit, judgment, and the execution of an efficient, time saving pace and track in meeting the specific challenges incorporated into the course by the course designer. The open numerical scoring system will be used, with the judge's score announced after each round. The winner is the rider with the highest cumulative score from round 1 and the jump off/work off round. The remaining placings for the class (competitors not participating in the jump off), will be determined solely by the first round score (after deducting jumping and time faults), but regardless of clear rounds.

**Start Order:** Round 1 will be computer drawn, round 2 (The jump off round) will be from low to high from the score from the first round. There will be a 1.00m jumper class in the designated ring for the Championships earlier during the horse show, this class may be open to everyone.

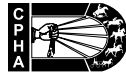

## 426. CPHA CHILD-ADULT MEDAL FINALS SILICON VALLEY EQUESTRIAN FESTIVAL II ONLY

**First and Second Rounds** The class will be held over a 3' course with a minimum of eight fences with at least two changes of direction. There will be two rounds with scores announced for each round and averaged together for the final score. All riders will return for Round Two in the reverse order of go. The top four riders from Rounds 1 and 2 and anyone within 3 points of the leader shall work off using USEF Eq. Tests 1-8.

The work-off score will not be announced. Riders will ride for ribbons and awards first thru tenth and a victory gallop. There will be two judges (when available) who must sit apart in rounds one and two. In the work-off judges may sit together. In each round there will be a specified call judge to break any ties for ribbons. In the final placings if there is a tie, the overall score from Round 2 will break the tie. Riders will not be asked to dismount or ride without stirrups. Riders may not compete if they have won any

medal, equitation, hunter or jumper class with fences 3'3" or higher or any rider who is currently showing at 3'6" or has shown 3'6" in the last 10 years.

Qualifying classes held prior to the finals at the same horse show are open only to those riders who have not yet qualified.

There is to be no contact between exhibitor and/or trainer to either judges or course designer prior to or at the conclusion of any round without the specified technical delegate or show steward present.

Substitutions: The same horse must be ridden through all phases of the competition. However, due to illness or injury of the horse a rider may petition to ride a substitute horse. This substitution must be approved by the Appeals Committee consisting of the Show Manager, the Chief Steward and the Official Veterinarian, who has in fact examined the horse and determined it's unsuitability to continue.

## 428. CPHA HORSEMANSHIP MEDAL FINALS SILICON VALLEY EQUESTRIAN FESTIVAL II ONLY



Entry Fee: \$125

**First and Second Rounds** The class will be held over a 2'6" course with a minimum of eight fences, no combinations, and at least two changes of direction. There will be two rounds with scores announced for each round and averaged together for the final score. All riders will return for Round Two in the reverse order of go. There will be a work-off after the two rounds with the top 4 and anyone within 3 points of the leader or a score of 80 or above using USEF Equitation Tests 1-8.

All riders will ride for ribbons and awards first thru tenth and victory gallop. There will be two judges (when available) who must sit apart in rounds one and two. In the work-off judges may sit together. In each round there will be a specified call judge to break any ties for ribbons. In the final placings if there is a tie, the overall score from Round 2 will break the tie. Riders will not be asked to dismount or ride without stirrups. Riders may not compete if they

have won any medal, equitation, hunter or jumper class with fences 3' or higher or any rider who is currently showing at 3'3" or has shown 3'3" in the last 10 years.

Qualifying classes held prior to the finals at the same horse show are open only to those riders who are not qualified.

There is to be no contact between exhibitor and trainer to either judges or course designer prior to or at the conclusion of any round without the specified technical delegate or show steward present.

Substitutions: The same horse must be ridden through all phases of the competition. However, due to illness or injury of the horse a rider may petition to ride a substitute horse. This substitution must be approved by the Appeals Committee consisting of the Show Manager, the Chief Steward and the Official Veterinarian, who has in fact examined the horse and determined it's unsuitability to continue.

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# RULES, REGULATIONS & GENERAL INFORMATION

1. This show is covered by the rules and specifications of the current USEF, PCHA and NorCal Rule Books and will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith. Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Preliminary Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A nonmember may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$45 Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot (exception: Friesian performance FR222) and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

**2. FEDERATION ENTRY AGREEMENT:** By entering a Federation-licensed Competition and signing this entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaulteur or Longeur and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Bylaws and Rules of The United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (the "Federation") and the local rules of the competition. I agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the Federation and of the competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the Rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered. I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cablecasts, or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation. The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See GR908.4.

**3. CONDITIONS OF ENTRY:** Every horse entered for competition will be under the control of the Horse Show Management, but Horse Show Management will, in no case, be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless the Horse

Show and its officials, employees, directors, officers, The Horse Park at Woodside, West Palms Event Management, and its Sponsors, etc for any loss or accident to his horse, horses, employees or equipment which may occur from sickness, fire or other cause.

**4. MANAGEMENT:** Horse Show Management reserves the right to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to or arising out of an incident to the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered in these Rules and Regulations shall be decided by Horse Show Management-their decision to be final. Horse Show Management reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally or to cancel any entries, disqualify riders or exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries and cancel award prizes, without claim for damages; to change any course, to cancel or combine any unfilled classes, or to reschedule classes, after due notice to exhibitors; to change rings or rotate or change judges and officials; to change specifications in jumper classes in order to facilitate the time schedule. Management reserves the right to combine or cancel. Management reserves the right to limit entries in a class. Refused entries will be returned.

**5. ASSUMPTION OF RISK:** By signing the entry blank, the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaulteur or Loungeur acknowledges that horseback riding, particularly jumping, is a dangerous activity and involves inherent risks that may cause serious injury and in some cases death because of the unpredictable nature and irrational behavior of horses, regardless of their training and past performance and expressly assumes all such inherent risks whether identified herein, in the entry blank, or in the Federation Rules and Regulations. A horse, without warning or any apparent cause, can buck, stumble, fall, rear, bite, kick, run, make unpredictable movements, spook, jump obstacles, step on a person's foot or push a person-all of which may cause the rider or observer to fall or be jolted, resulting in serious injury or death. A horse may also become loose and cause injury to an observer or rider or to another horse-a loose horse can run at full gallop in a panic and run into objects or persons or other horses. The Show Ground Facilities are bordered by highways/roads and thus noise from traffic and other sources occurs that can and will cause a horse to unexpectedly spook or react quickly. The Show Ground Facilities contain roads or driveways that are traversed by cars, golf carts, tractors, trailers and heavy equipment all of which may spook a horse. The above warnings and risks are meant as an example of some of the risks that are inherent and may be encountered but it is agreed this is not an exhaustive list and there are numerous additional conditions and/or events that may result in injuries while participating in the Competition and/or being present on the Show Ground Facility.

## 6. THE FOLLOWING IS REQUIRED FOR EACH ENTRY:

- A. All horses on grounds must be registered on an entry blank including horses not entered in classes. One entry blank per horse.
- B. Entry forms must be complete with owner, riders, trainers and payee information including association membership numbers.
- C. Date of Birth of all minor exhibitors.

D. Signatures of owner, riders, trainer and parent or guardian of minor exhibitors. Parents or guardians of minor exhibitors shall hold the Horse Shows, West Palms Event Management, Horse Park at Woodside and staff harmless for injury to such minor(s).

E. USEF name of horse, and the correct description of horse including 1st or 2nd Year status and the USHJA ID number.

F. For all horses include Nomination and Stall Fees as a deposit.

Make checks payable to West Palms Event Management. Or complete the credit card information, credit card authorization form and sign on the entry blank.

**7. PAYMENT:** An open check or credit card is required at time of check in before numbers will be issued. See 6F for deposit information. A 3% credit card fee will be applied to all credit card transactions and is non refundable after the card has been processed.

**8. REFUNDS:** Request for a refund of the deposit must be in writing and received before the closing date of entries and a \$35.00 fee will be deducted after the close of entries. The nominating and stall fees are not refundable under any condition after the close of entries. Credit Card fees are nonrefundable at any time after the card has been processed.

**9. POST ENTRIES:** Entries received with payment after the close of entries but before the Monday of each show week will pay a \$75.00 late fee. All entries received at the show will pay a \$150.00 late fee.

**10. ADDS/SCRATCHES:** All adds must be made by 5:00 pm the day prior to each class. No entries will be accepted for a class scheduled on the same day. **In the unusual case the time schedule allows a management approved add the day of a class, the entry fee will be double.** Horses and riders who go in a class without entering will pay a fee of \$50.00 in addition to the cost of the class. All scratches must be received in the show office before the start of the class in writing to be considered for a refund; scratches via phone call or at the gate will NOT be considered. In divisions that are entered by complete section, no refund will be considered if the horse shows in any class of the division. The only other refunds given will be for cancellation of a class by Management, overpayment of fees, or the rejection of entries because of ineligibility or lack of stall space.

**11. PRIZE MONEY:** Checks will be mailed within 30 days of the show's conclusion. **NO PRIZE MONEY WILL BE MAILED UNLESS THE OWNER'S OR PAYEE'S SOCIAL SECURITY/TAX ID Number IS LISTED ON THE ENTRY FORM.** Any prize money that is to be paid to someone other than the owner listed on the entry blank must be written on the form when submitted. Change of payee will not be permitted at the show. The Internal Revenue Service requires 30% of prize money won by foreign exhibitors to be withheld. Foreign exhibitors should apply for a U.S. Social Security number and are required to complete a W-8 Certificate of Foreign Status Form. Unless otherwise stated, prize money will be distributed through 8th place as follows- 30%, 22%, 15%, 10%, 7%, 6%, 5%, 5%. Management reserves the right to adjust the prize money of any class if there are less than 10 horses entered as of 5:00 PM the day before the class or at

management's discretion. Prize money will not be paid out to classes that are run with fewer than 3 entries.

**12. RAIN:** In the event of rain prior to the Show, it is the riders' responsibility to call Show Management to determine whether the show is cancelled.

**13. RESPONSIBILITY OF PAYMENT OF SERVICES AND SUPPLIES:** All owners and exhibitors will be held responsible for any damage incurred by them, their animals, agents, or employees, to stalls, buildings and other properties on the Show grounds and shall be billed accordingly. All bills for veterinary, farrier services and feed/bedding are due and payable during the Show. Management reserves the right to deduct any unpaid veterinary, farrier and feed/bedding bills from premium money due the exhibitor. Any exhibitor not meeting his obligations to the official Show Veterinarian, farrier and feed/bedding vendor will be termed an undesirable exhibitor and entries from that exhibitor may not be accepted at subsequent shows.

**14. RETURNED CHECKS/CHARGEBACKS ON CREDIT CARD CHARGES:** Checks returned by the bank for any reason or a credit card reversal are regarded as a most serious offense and will be handled according to the following procedure: A \$50 penalty will be assessed for each returned check or credit card reversal or 10% of the face value of the check or credit card charge- whichever is greater. Accounts will be given five (5) days to be paid in full or they will be reported to the U.S. Equestrian Federation, Inc., PCHA and other appropriate association(s) for further disciplinary action. Checks will not be deposited a second time. In the case that the debt is not cleared within 30 days of the conclusion of the show, all prize money will be forfeited.

**15. UNPAID CHARGES:** Any exhibitor leaving the show with an unpaid balance will be billed for these charges and a \$50 billing fee will be added to the total due. Until these charges are settled, all further entries of rider and owner will be returned.

**16. STABLING:** 10' x 12' North stalls are \$325.00 if pre-paid with the Nomination fee by the closing date of entries and \$375.00 if payment is not included. 10' x 10' North Hill and Sand Hill stalls are available for \$275 each if pre-paid with the Nomination fee by the closing date of entries and \$325.00 if payment is not included. All 10' x 12' Grand Prix stalls are \$350.00 if pre-paid with the Nomination fee by the closing date of entries and \$400.00 if payment is not included. Stalls are of portable construction with top and bottom doors. Hauling in is permitted and will be charged \$75.00 per day. No bedding included. Water buckets and hoses must be provided by the exhibitor. NO straw or synthetic/paper materials permitted- only wood shavings. It is strictly forbidden to remove stall doors. Exhibitors will be billed for any damage to property. **Upon departure from the show, if excessive cleanup is required there will be a \$500 fee charged. Trainers are encouraged to supervise their staff to avoid this fee.**

**17. SAFETY REGULATIONS:** Unauthorized use of the light fixtures

will result in removal of your appliance. Smoking or open flame devices are not permitted within the stables. Keep flammable decorations to a minimum. Electrical outlets are provided.

**18. CLOSED RINGS:** Horses are not permitted in any ring where a course is set unless otherwise given permission from management, or when there is equipment in the ring. Please check with the show office for information regarding schooling policies. Horses and riders must yield immediately for watering and dragging. Violations of the above mentioned rules may be considered cause for elimination from the show.

**19. SHOW RINGS & SCHOOLING RINGS:** In all jumper classes, competitors will be given forty-five (45) seconds to cross the start line. All show and warm-up arenas consist of sand/fiber footing. Jumper Rings 139' X 282', 175' X 360', Hunter Rings 135' X 230', 190' X 300'.

**20. COMPUTER RANKING:** The Grand Prix classes are not eligible for the ROLEX/USEF Show Jumping Ranking list.

**21. FEED AND BEDDING:** Feed & bedding will be handled by the horse show office. Pre-orders must be ordered by using the form included in this book and emailed to [feed@westpalmsevents.com](mailto:feed@westpalmsevents.com). Orders made during the show need to be in writing in the show office. Orders must be made by 1 P.M. each day for same-day delivery.

**22. RV RESERVATIONS:** Contact [feed@westpalmsevents.com](mailto:feed@westpalmsevents.com). Please send form with your entry.

**23. SCHOOLING SUPERVISION:** Gate Stewards are schooling supervisors and have absolute authority to scratch riders who do not follow USEF or appropriate association schooling rules.

**24. NUMBERS:** Management will provide a number card for each competitor which shall be worn clearly visible to the judge at all times when in competition. Riders wearing the wrong number or no number at all MAY be eliminated from the class by the judges.

**25. DOGS:** Dogs and other pets must be confined to the Stable Area. Dogs must be on a leash at all times. Stray dogs and dogs in violation will be impounded by Animal Control authorities. Under no circumstances are dogs allowed at the arenas.

**26. VACCINATION INFORMATION:** Beginning December 1, 2016, all horses entering the grounds of a Federation- licensed competition must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the stables. The management in consultation with respected veterinarians and local animal health authorities strongly recommend and urge that all horses attending the show follow a two-part West Nile vaccination protocol consisting of a primary vaccination, followed by a booster 3-6 weeks later. Should you have any questions please contact the CDFAC.

**27. ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE: Silicon Valley Equestrian Festival I:** Stalls will be available at 10:00 on Monday, August 21. All stalls must be vacated by Sunday, August 26 unless staying for the second week.

**Silicon Valley Equestrian Festival II:** Stalls will be available at 10:00 on Monday, August 27. All stalls must be vacated by Sunday, September 1.

No layovers without prior authorization. Early/late arrivals must have prior management approval and will be charged \$50 per stall/tack room per night. Early arrivals without the approval of management will be charged \$65.00 per stall per night.

**28. MAIL/TELEPHONE:** During the show all mail should be sent to exhibitors as follows: Horse Park at Woodside, Horse Show Office, 3674 Sand Hill Rd, Woodside, CA 94062. For info - (360) 977-3518.

**29. PROTEST:** Any USEF member lodging a protest must first deposit \$200 (non-members \$300) payable to Sacramento International Horse Show for the Sacramento Shows and West Palms Event Management for the Del Mar shows with the Show Secretary, which sum shall be forfeited to the Horse Show, if same is not sustained. All protests must be in writing, signed by the protester and filed within 48 hours of the occurrence of the alleged violation. A protest may be filed with the Show Manager, the Federation Hearing Committee, or Show Secretary. If the protest is sustained, the entries standing next in award shall be moved up accordingly. See USEF GR603 & 603.1.

**30. HELMET RULE:** It is compulsory for all persons at Federation licensed hunter, jumper or hunter/jumper competitions when mounted anywhere on the competition grounds, to wear properly fastened protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. It must be properly fitted with harness secured. Exception: In Hunter or Jumper classes, adults may be allowed to remove their headgear while accepting prizes and during the playing of the National Anthem only; they must refasten their headgear prior to the lap of honor. It is compulsory for riders in Paso Fino classes, both open and breed restricted including Hunter Hack, where jumping is required and when jumping anywhere on the competition grounds to wear properly fastened protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. It must be properly fitted with harness secured. A Show Committee, Competition Management, and Licensed Officials must bar riders without protective headgear from entering the ring for classes in which protective headgear is required and may bar any entry or person from entering the ring if not suitably presented to appear before an audience.

**31. DRUG TESTING:** State of California drug testing rules apply. For a copy contact the Show Office.

**32. GOLF CARTS AND BICYCLES:** Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate

a motorized vehicle of any kind including but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above-described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent(s), legal guardian(s), or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offenses. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Rule 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

**33. PARKING:** Parking allowed in designated areas only. Violators parked in NO PARKING ZONES and FIRE LANES will be issued citations and/or towed from the premises at the owner's expense. There are Handicap parking areas in the Stable Area and public parking lot. VIP Parking is also available. Please email [ak@westpalmsevents.com](mailto:ak@westpalmsevents.com) to reserve your space as space is limited.

**34. WASHING HORSES:** Nozzles are required on all hoses to help conserve water. Violators will be fined \$50 for each violation.

**35. STALL CLEANING:** Please deposit all manure at the ends of the barn aisles and NOT in the middle or in front of the stalls.

**36. TURNOUTS AND LUNGING:** Horses may not be turned-out in arenas at any time. Lunging in designated areas only. No lunging after 7:00 am.

**37. MEDICAL WASTE:** All needles and syringes MUST be deposited in designated disposal containers and not left in stalls or thrown in trash receptacles. Violators will be fined \$75 per needle/syringe. For the first offense the trainer/owner will be notified as well as the appropriate association. The second offense will disqualify the individual and horse and they will be banished from the show with NO REFUND.

**38. POLING:** Poling is prohibited in the State of California. No bamboo or offsets allowed on the Show ground's. Non-compliance will result in elimination from the show.

**39. ORDER OF GO:** There will be a posted order of go in all classes. Any anticipated scheduling conflicts should be brought to the attention of the starters who will advise you on how it will be resolved. Under no circumstances will the Horse Show be interrupted due to a competitor failing to present himself at the gate in a timely manner. Multiple rides must be shown in the correct order. Failure to do so will result in elimination. In hunter classes with double rounds, a posted order will be observed with a rotation of three rounds.

**40. AWARDS PRESENTATIONS:** In all classes, an awards presentation

will be made. A suitable horse should be available for classes where it is required to ride for awards. Riders failing to present themselves for award presentations will forfeit all prize money.

**41. CHAMPION AND RESERVE CHAMPION AWARDS:** Champion and Reserve will be awarded in all divisions that have three classes that fill.

**42. INSURANCE:** All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents, or their animals. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

**43. OFFICE & GROUNDS:** All horses entered in the competition must pay a mandatory office/grounds fee of \$75.00.

**44. NON-SHOWING HORSE:** All non-showing horses must pay a \$75.00 fee in addition to standard fees.

**45. TIES:** In all jumper classes, ties involving first place will be jumped off. All other ties will be determined by time taken to complete the first round.

**46. ATTIRE:** Proper attire required in all classes.

**47. SUBSTITUTIONS:** Substitution of horses are allowed with the same owner.

**48. NON SMOKING EVENT:** The events included in this prize list are non smoking events in accordance with California State Law SB-977 Tobacco: youth sports events.

**49. MICROCHIP VERIFICATION:** All horses competing in classes that require USHJA horse registration must provide a microchip number that verifies their animal's identity in order to compete for points, money won or be eligible for Federation and/or USHJA programs and awards where horses are required to be recorded or registered. A microchip used to verify identity must be a fifteen-digit ISO compliant 11784/11785 chip and be implanted in the nuchal ligament of the animal. All horses that are competing in classes which require USHJA registration which are not microchipped will be ineligible to compete in Federation licensed competitions, Exceptions: USHJA Outreach and those activities enumerated in GR901.9, items 1-9.

**50. SAFE SPORT VERIFICATION:** As of January 1, 2019 all USEF members 18-years-old and older, with a Competing Membership, must complete SafeSport Training in order to be eligible to participate in USEF activities, including competitions. Please see the USEF website at <https://www.usef.org/compete/resources-forms/rulesregulations/safe-sport> for more information. Those who do not complete the training will be ineligible to participate in USEF activities, including competitions.

**JUDGING FOR ALL HUNTER SECTIONS:** To be judged on performance and soundness, suitability to count.

**ELIGIBILITY FOR ADULT AMATEURS: HUNTER, JUMPER AND EQUITATION:** To be ridden by exhibitors who have reached their 18th birthday as of December 1 of the current competition year and who hold a current USEF Amateur certification. Open to horses and ponies.

**ELIGIBILITY FOR CHILDREN'S SECTIONS: HUNTER, JUMPER AND EQUITATION:** To be ridden by exhibitors who have not reached their 18th birthday as of December 1 of the current competition year.

**ADULT AMATEUR HUNTER** Sections offered and requirements: Adult Amateurs – may be split into three (3) sections. **Cross Entry: Riders:** Riders may not cross enter into any Amateur Owner hunter class (at the same competition), First Year, Second Year or High Performance Working Hunter at the same competition. Exception - under saddle classes. Adult Amateur Riders may not cross enter into any class at the same competition with fences exceeding 3'3" except Jumper Classes exceeding 1.20m, Equitation and Medal Classes, and the USHJA National Hunter Derby.
